Sometimes the size of your room, and the positioning of windows and doors means there is only one layout that will work... and no matter how many ways you reposition the bed, it just doesn't feel right.



The master bedroom, (which lead to a walk-in robe and ensuite), was large overall, but each individual room was quite small. So, the challenge was to make it work with the shape we had, and be appealing enough not to bore the owners over time.

There were no defining features in this room, except for the garden outlook, so my goal was to inject some character by creating some architectural features.



The doorway arches were removed and replaced with a square opening.

Skirting, architraves and cornices were changed to a period style that gives the room a sense of being here for a long time.

To give an appearance of lengthening the walls, we turned the wallpaper on its side and away from the traditional vertical stripes.



Complimenting these details... colour and texture is what creates the interest.



The slight shimmer in the wallpaper and the fabric bedhead, creates an elegant look while the simple palette of white, off-white and duck-egg blues are all this room needed for a sophisticated impact.

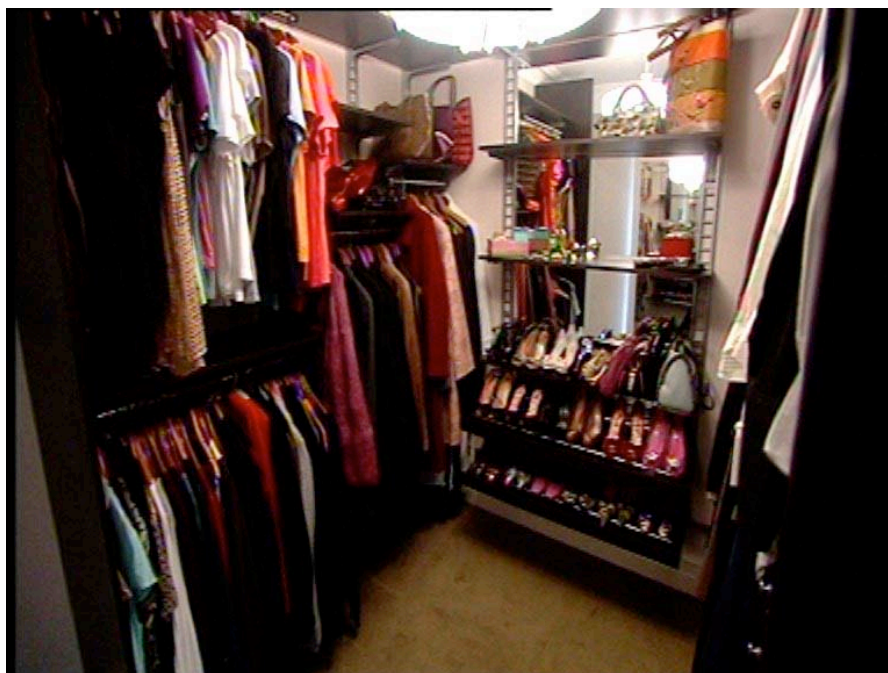
Simplicity is the key to making this room work and not cluttering it too much, other than adding a few simple photos and decorative items.
